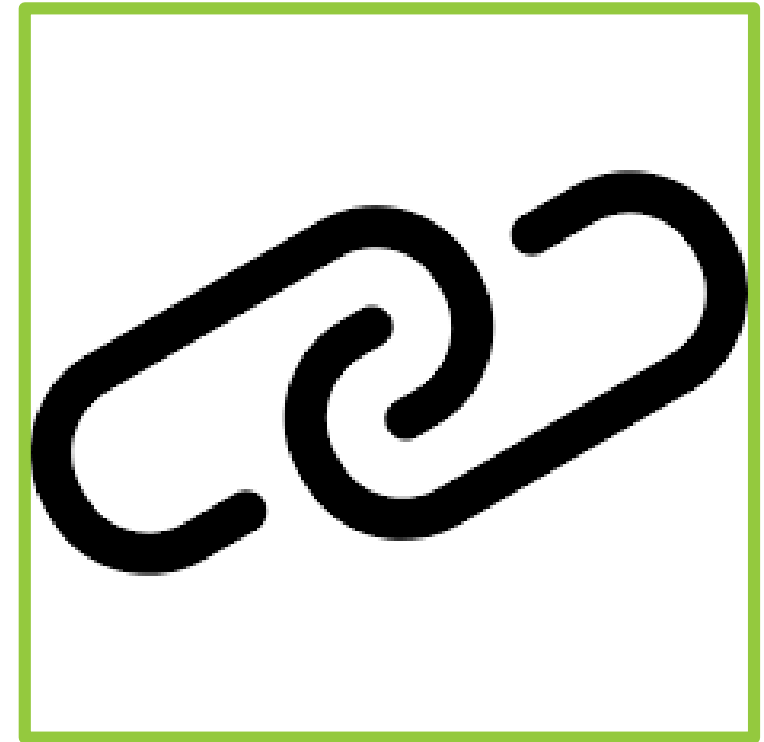

St. Vincent Prep Academy: Plan #1

Plan #1: At SVFS

***Franklin County Level 1,2,3 on Ohio's Public Health Advisory System or if otherwise recommended; Families must assess student's health daily**

- Limited enrollment & reduced class/group sizes: **6 students per class**
- Consistent care team members assigned to each class/group
 - 1 Teacher
 - 1 Behavioral Specialist
 - 1 Group Clinician
- Social distancing practiced in classrooms and hallways
- No shared supplies between students
- Face masks required for SVFS employees and children
 - *Masks available for children at SVFS*
- Temperatures of SVFS employees and children taken upon arrival
- Hand washing required upon arrival and dismissal, encouraged frequently throughout the day
- Regular disinfection of high-touch surfaces and rooms
- Breakfast and lunch served in classroom
- Family Counseling will remain virtual (Telehealth)

St. Vincent Prep Academy: Plan #1 In the Classroom



- Student desks distanced 6 ft. apart
- Only equipment and materials that can be regularly disinfected
- Individual school supply kits for each student
- Classes/groups remain separate; no intermixing



St. Vincent Prep Academy: Plan #1

Transportation

- Vendor companies: Transportation provided by SVFS to and from St. Vincent Prep Academy for students who cannot be transported by parent/guardian
 - ***Parent/guardian should not send children who are ill or have a fever***
 - Drivers, aides & children are required to wear masks during vendor transport to and from SVFS
 - Masks available for children on all vehicles
 - Decreased capacity and assigned seating to promote social distancing
 - Temperatures taken upon exiting the vehicle
- Parent/Guardian drop-off: Area designated at the back of our building
 - Children and family members must stay inside the vehicle at all times
 - Temperatures taken upon exiting the vehicle
- School district buses may also be used as needed



St. Vincent Prep Academy: Plan #2

Plan #2: At Home

*Families will be notified of plan transition through *One Call Now*

- Academic instruction delivered virtually by SVFS Teachers
 - Google Classroom: video lessons, independent work, access to supplemental activities
 - SVFS will support with technology and supplies
- Behavioral Health Groups delivered virtually by SVFS Clinicians
 - Delivered daily via Zoom
- Family Counseling will remain virtual (Telehealth)

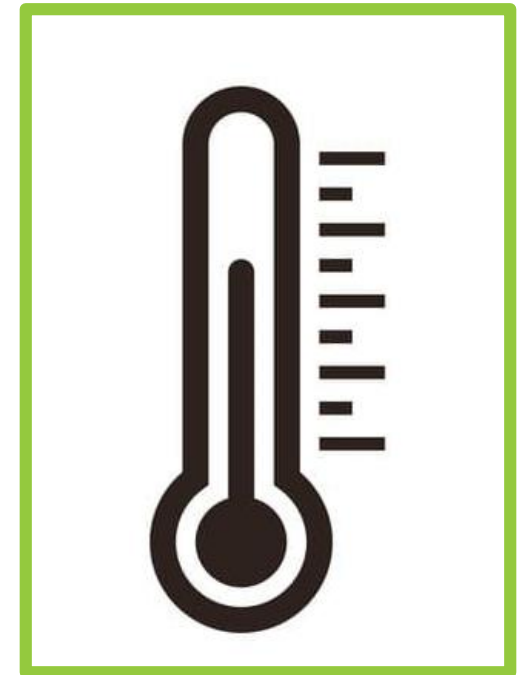
Health Protocols & Medical Recommendations

- Face masks have been proven to protect against and slow the spread of COVID-19
- A statewide mask order has been issued by Ohio Governor Mike DeWine, effective July 23rd
 - Mask order for K-12 students attending schools announced August 4th
- Face masks must be worn appropriately by all employees and children
 - On-site and while riding on transportation
 - Youth face masks are available on-site and provided to each student upon arrival
- *We need your help*
 - Keeping SVFS safe and healthy for our children and our care team is a collaborative effort



Health Protocols & Medical Recommendations

- A temperature of **100.4F (38C) or higher** is considered a symptom for illness
- Symptoms of COVID-19 may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus. Children have presented with similar symptoms to adults and generally have mild illness.
 - Fever or chills
 - Cough
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - Fatigue
 - Muscle or body aches
 - Headache
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Sore throat
 - Congestion or runny nose
 - Nausea or vomiting
 - Diarrhea



Health Protocols & Medical Recommendations: At Home

- Families must assess student's health daily before arrival to St. Vincent Prep Academy
- Take temperature daily: If temperature is **100.4F (38C) or higher**, students must stay home until **fever-free for 72 hours**
- Watch for symptoms daily: If your child displays **2 or more symptoms**, they must remain home until **symptom-free for 72 hours**.
- **You must provide a doctor's note clearing your child to return to St. Vincent Prep Academy.**



Health Protocols & Medical Recommendations: At St. Vincent Prep Academy

- St. Vincent Prep Academy's care team will assess student's health daily
- If a student becomes ill during the day (temperature is **100.4F (38C) or higher** or develops **2 or more symptoms**):
 - SVFS Nursing will call Guardian (Emergency Contacts if unable to reach Guardian)
 - Student must be picked up **within 1 hour**
 - Student must remain home until **fever-free for 72 hours**
- **You must provide a doctor's note clearing your child to return to St. Vincent Prep Academy.**



Health Protocols & Medical Recommendations

- Practice thorough handwashing frequently
 - Use soap and water
 - Wash for at least 20 seconds
- Children are required to wash hands upon arrival and before dismissal each day
 - Sinks are easily accessible and fully stocked with soap
 - Monitored by SVFS's care team members



General Cleaning & Safety Measures

Maintaining a clean and healthy environment for our children, our families and our care team is our top priority.

- Increased agency-wide cleaning and sanitation measures are in compliance with requirements enforced by the Ohio Department of Health
 - Frequent cleaning of high-touch items and surfaces
 - Daily disinfection of building
 - Limitation of shared objects
 - Cleaning products rated to be effective against Coronaviruses
